# General Information

**NOTE:** To provide additional enrollment opportunities for undergraduate students, external courses scheduled for Summer 2010, normally open only to adult undergraduates, will be open to eligible traditional undergraduates.

To be eligible, a student must have completed at least 30 credits and have a GPA of at least 3.00 or have completed at least 60 credits and have a GPA of at least 2.75. Eligible students wishing to enroll in one or more external courses, will need the permission of their advisor and Assistant Dean, Harriet Schenk. Students will be limited to two external courses. Students enrolling in an external course should be aware that these courses require significant independent work and self-discipline and also attendance at an Orientation scheduled for Saturday, May 1. Once a student enrolls, he/she will be provided with additional information. The semester for external courses is May 17 – July 30.

## Caldwell College E-mail Account

Caldwell College **requires** that all students use their college issued e-mail account. It is easily accessible and does not change. Caldwell College uses this e-mail address for all official communication to the College community.

The College reserves the right to cancel a course in which there is insufficient enrollment, to limit registration, and to change instructors when necessary. **This brochure is subject to change. Please check your bill and schedule carefully for any changes.**

## College Closings

Call the Emergency closing Hotline number, 973-618-3100, after 6:00 a.m. for day classes, and 3:00 p.m. to see if evening classes are cancelled OR go to the College Web site [www.caldwell.edu](http://www.caldwell.edu). Please note that cancellation of daytime classes does not necessarily mean that evening classes are also cancelled.

## Financial Aid

Financial aid is available providing students enroll on a half time basis (6 credits). Remember you must complete the *Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)* at least **six weeks** prior to your intended start date. Applications are available online at [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov). Additionally, there are several alternative loan resources available to students, including some loans for students who wish to enroll for less than the 6 credits. Students who are awarded Federal financial assistance and subsequently withdraw from **all** coursework prior to 61% of term completion are subject to the Federal refund/repayment policy. ## Grade Reports

Matriculating and Certificate students have access to Caldwell College's online services and are able to view and print their grades directly from the web. The Registrar's Office will not send grade reports in the mail. ## Health Requirements

All students are required to comply with the State of New Jersey immunization laws. All documentation should be submitted to Health Services. *Health Services will not be responsible for records, which are submitted to other departments.* **Failure to comply with the state's requirements will result in cancellation of registration and exclusion from class.** All full-time students (12 or more credits) must have health insurance. Please refer to the Student Health Form for all requirements. Health forms can be obtained in the Health Services Department or the Center for Graduate & Continuing Studies and on the web at [www.caldwell.edu/student\\_services/health.aspx](http://www.caldwell.edu/student_services/health.aspx). Should further clarification be required after reviewing the health form, please call 973-618-3319.

## Tuition Refund Policy

If a student files an official withdrawal or add/drop form with the Center for Graduate & Continuing Studies or the Registrar, they will be entitled to a refund according to the following schedule:

After the first class	80%
After the second class	60%
After the third class	<b>NO REFUND</b>

## Withdrawal Information

An official **WITHDRAWAL** form must be completed for all courses from which a student wishes to withdraw. Not attending, even with notification to the instructor, does not constitute an official withdrawal. Students will be responsible for tuition and receive a grade of an 'F' for courses from which they do not **OFFICIALLY** withdraw. See page 6 for Add/Drop and Withdrawal dates.

# Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 protects the privacy of education records, establishes the right of students to inspect and review their education records, and provides guidelines for the contesting of inaccurate or misleading data.

Students have the right to inspect and review all education records maintained by the College. The College is not required to provide copies unless, for reasons such as great distance, it is impossible for students to inspect the records.

Students have the right to request that the College correct records believed to be inaccurate or misleading. If the College decides not to amend the record, the student has a right to a formal hearing with the Vice President & Dean of Academic Affairs. After the hearing, if the College still decides not to amend the record, the student has the right to place a statement with the record commenting on the contested information in the record.

The College will not release any confidential information from a student's record without the written consent of the student, with the exception of the following: to College officials, including contractors and volunteers performing institutional functions, with a legitimate educational interest, to other Institutions at which a student seeks or intends to enroll, to certain government officials in order to carry out lawful functions, to appropriate parties in connection with financial aid to a student, to organizations conducting certain studies for the College, to accrediting organizations, to individuals who have obtained court orders or subpoenas, and to persons who need to know in cases of health and safety emergencies.

The College may disclose directory information without the written consent of the student. Directory information includes the following: name, address, telephone number, e-mail address, dates of attendance, enrollment status, class, previous institutions attended, major and minor field of study, awards, honors (including Dean's list), degrees conferred including date, past and present participation in officially recognized activities, student's photograph, height and weight (for athletes only), and date and place of birth.

Students may request the withholding of disclosure of directory information. To ensure that a request is properly processed, it must be submitted on the official "Request to Prevent Disclosure of Directory Information" Form, which is available in the Office of the Registrar. In order to prevent all disclosures of directory information, the official request must be filed prior to the first day of the semester. However, the College will accept requests at any point during the semester. The request will remain in effect until the student submits signed authorization to allow disclosure of directory information. The College assumes that failure on the part of any student to specifically request on the official form the withholding of release of directory information indicates individual approval of disclosure.

Students have the right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by the College to comply with the requirements of FERPA. Contact the Family Policy Compliance Office, U.S. Department of Education, 400 Maryland Avenue, SW, Washington, DC 20202.

### Non-Matriculating Visiting Students

Caldwell College welcomes non-matriculating and visiting students through the Center for Graduate & Continuing Studies. Non-matriculating and visiting students may only accumulate a maximum of 12 credits before they **MUST** apply for matriculation (going through the admissions process).

### Tuition Reductions

A 10% tuition reduction is extended to:

- Graduates of Caldwell College enrolled in **graduate** courses.
- Graduate students whose spouse, child or siblings are concurrently enrolled at Caldwell College as full-time undergraduate students.

A 20% tuition reduction is extended to:

- Matriculating Adult Undergraduate students if they are actively involved in parish work on a paid or volunteer basis in a Catholic church-related institution. Appropriate documentation from a pastor or supervisor must be submitted to the GCS each semester at the point of registration.

A 25% tuition reduction is extended to:

- All graduates of Caldwell College who enroll in **undergraduate** courses.
- Members of religious orders other than Dominicans.
- Full-time Catholic school teachers, principals, nurses, librarians and other Catholic school employees whose positions ordinarily require state certification. Documentation of employment forwarded to GCS is required at the point of registration.
- Students matriculating in the M.A. in Pastoral Ministry program actively involved in the work of the ministry on a paid or volunteer basis in a church-related institution. Documentation of employment or service is required at the point of registration.
- Active Law Enforcement, Corrections & Fire Fighting officers.

A 50% tuition reduction is extended to those in the Dominican order.

A 100% tuition reduction is extended to Caldwell Dominican Sisters.

Senior Citizens, 62 years of age or older may take courses for credit at a reduced rate of \$585 per course.

## Students Seeking N.J. Certification

If you seek certification from the N.J. Department of Education, you must submit the **"Intent to Seek N.J. Certification" form** (available on the graduate "common forms" web page or in the Center for Graduate & Continuing Studies). **Note:** If you are enrolled in the Post-Baccalaureate Teaching Certification Program, you need not submit this form *unless* your student teaching experience was waived. **Forms and payment must be submitted by the deadline below or your paperwork will not go the State until the following semester:**

Fall: **October 1** • Spring: **February 1** • Summer: **June 1**

## Non-Degree Students in Art Therapy, A.B.A., or Special Education

If you desire a printed certificate indicating your completion of one of these three *non-degree* programs, file the "Application for Certificate of Completion of a Non-Degree program" at least one month prior to the end of the semester you will finish. Forms are available on the "common forms" web page or from the Graduate Office. Failure to submit an application will not affect your academic status, but you will not receive a printed certificate. **Note:** *Printed certificates indicate completion of a Caldwell College program, not professional certification or licensure.*
