Credits toward both undergraduate and graduate degrees are offered through the Travel Courses. This January classes went to Spain and Italy. It's time to sign up now.

### **Upcoming Travel Opportunities**

The Center for Graduate and Continuing Studies has been working in conjunction with the Art Department and the Foreign Language Department to offer a week long trip to **Sicily** at the end of the semester, **May 19–May 26**. This will be the second trip to Sicily offered by the college. Three courses will be offered with this short study abroad opportunity: two art courses (one for the core and one for Art majors), and one Italian culture course (fulfills one of the core foreign language requirements). Once again, Catholic University in **Seoul, South Korea** will be sponsoring a trip for students at selected colleges throughout the US, Australia and Canada. Students who are selected will pay for airfare and for course credits. Catholic University will pay for room, board, field trip fees and transportation. In 2006 Caldwell College sent five students including two Continuing Studies. They had a great trip! This year's trip is scheduled to last from **May 19 through June 2**. You will spend two weeks learning about the history and culture of Korea. South Korea is a fascinating blending of old and new. Applications are now available on the Caldwell website. Applications will be accepted in February and only five seats are available. Take this once in a lifetime opportunity to spend two weeks learning about South Korea!

Each year, Caldwell College students, faculty and staff can take part in an international study experience to **Fanjeaux, France** where St. Dominic's vision of an order devoted to seeking and sharing the truth took shape from 1206 to 1216. This year's trip is from **May 26 to June 12**. In the three-credit course, "France in the Middle Ages", students learn about the history, philosophy, art and literature of the period, both in class and on field trips to historic sites in southern France with a focus on places significant in the early history of the Order of Preachers. As a community of learners, we will enjoy simple living and good meals at the Belvedere, a Dominican guest-house. The program concludes with four nights in Paris. ### ■ Don't forget your Graduation Check and Graduation Application

If you have **90 or more credits**, it's time to schedule an appointment for a Graduation Check with your advisor. It is an easy way to avoid any nasty surprises later on. Just let the office staff know that you want a 'grad check'. The number to call to make an appointment is **973-618-3203**.

In your senior year, you should also be getting ready to submit your graduation application. **A Graduation Application must be submitted in order to graduate.**

### Your Graduation Application is due in the following time frames:

- December graduates, your application is due in by May 1,
- May graduates, your application is due in by November 1, and
- August graduates your application is due in by February 1.

If you are planning on taking External Degree courses in the upcoming semesters, you will want to save the date for the future mandatory Adult Undergraduate Orientation/External Degree Day. The future dates are the following:

**Summer 2008** . . . .May 3, 2008

**Spring 2009** . . . .January 10, 2009

External Degree Day is an integral part of the External Degree Program at Caldwell; attendance at the class meeting on External Degree Day is mandatory for everyone taking an External Course.

## ■ Caldwell College presents "Focus on Sicily II Spring 2008"

Last year's Focus on Sicily lecture series was such a great success that we decided to do it again. Over 200 people enjoyed the first lecture in the series, The first lecture, *Sicilian Middle Ages from the Arabs to the Vespers: Moslems and Christians in Sicily* was presented on Saturday, January 26 by the ever popular Dr. Gaetano Salemi. He held the audience spellbound as he told of the conquering Arabs and Normans in Sicily and discussed their legacy in art, architecture and politics.

The second lecture, *Sicily and Italian Opera* will be presented on **Saturday, March 1, 2008 from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon** in the Lecture Hall, Academic Building. Again, back by popular demand, this lecture will feature an overview of the Sicilian connections to Italian opera by Caldwell College Foreign Languages Professor Dr. Sally Jo Weber. She will explore the landscape, inspiration and characters of Italian operas which represent the passion of Sicily. Come and sing along to your favorite choruses from the Sicilian composer Vincenzo Bellini and the country people of Mascagni's *Cavalleria Rusticana*. Enjoy performances by Caldwell College Music Department singers.

And the last lecture, *Sicily on the Silver Screen: Witness to a Changing Italy* will be presented on **Saturday, April 12, 2008 from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon** in the Student Center Auditorium. Dr. Marisa Trubiano of Montclair State University will lead this tour through Italian cinema, focusing on films in which changes in modern Italian society are seen and interpreted through the prism of the Sicilian experience. Images of Sicily from neorealism (La Terra Trema, Visconti) to the present (Respiro, Crialese) will reveal much about ongoing issues of identity surrounding the island and the nation.

The lecture series is being sponsored by Caldwell College Center for Graduate & Continuing Studies, The Italian Teachers Association of New Jersey, The Coccia Foundation, The New Jersey Italian and Italian American Heritage Commission and Graphic Imagery, Inc.

Lectures are open to the public and will be held on the Caldwell College campus. Italian teachers can earn three professional hours for each session for a total of nine hours. Admission is \$25.00 per session. To

On **Saturday, April 19**, the Caldwell College Sociology/Criminal Justice Department will sponsor the second annual Forensic Competition for local high school students. The brainchild of Dr. Rosann Bar and Eileen Rainey Esq., the first CSI event last year attracted a capacity number of high schools and had a waiting list. Various crime scenes, including burglaries and a carjacking, were set up on campus, and high school students were required to process the crime scene to determine possible suspects. Students collected simulated blood, fiber, and other pieces of evidence from the crime scene and analyzed them in the college science laboratory.

This year, the competition will include up to 20 teams. **Dr. Rosann Bar is seeking alumni volunteers to be witnesses, judges, and possible victims. She could also use help in constructing the crime scene scenarios and setting up the clues to be investigated.**

### ART THERAPY PROGRAM

The Art Therapy Programs at Caldwell College and the New Jersey Art Therapy Association (NJATA) invite you to attend the seventh annual art therapy conference and art show, **Creative Action in Art Therapy, scheduled for Saturday, April 12** at the college. This all-day conference features presentations and workshops by well-known art therapy

professionals on topics current to the practice of art therapy, counseling and mental health. This year the keynote speaker is Patricia Allen, Ph.D., ATR, a native of West Orange, who now splits her time between California and Chicago. She is the author of two art therapy books: *Art Is A Way of Knowing* and *Art Is A Spiritual Path*. She teaches at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and facilitates workshops nationwide. Dr. Allen has been a primary voice in the community studio movement within art therapy and an advocate for the arts in social activism and art as spiritual practice.

As the only New Jersey institution offering graduate work in Art Therapy, Caldwell College has been pivotal in organizing and implementing what has become the **largest conference for art therapists in the state of New Jersey**.
