#### CALDWELL GRANTS

Awarded to full-time freshmen and transfer students who submit a completed FAFSA and demonstrate financial need. Grants range from \$2,000 to \$20,000 and are reviewed annually based on your family's financial need.

#### ATHLETIC GRANTS

Awarded to full-time students with exceptional athletic ability. Athletic awards vary and may be used for tuition and room and board.

#### FEDERAL GRANTS

A **Federal Pell Grant** is awarded to students who qualify, based on your family's income, assets and other data you provided when filing the FAFSA. Federal Pell grants range up to a maximum of \$5,730 per year.

The **Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (SEOG)** is for students with exceptional financial need to assist them with the costs of education. This grant is only available to students who are eligible to receive a Pell grant. SEOG awards range up to \$1,000 per year.

#### NEW JERSEY STATE PROGRAMS

Students who are residents of the State of New Jersey for a minimum of 12 consecutive months may be eligible for Tuition Aid Grants (TAG) or Educational Opportunity Fund Grants (EOF) based on need as determined by filing the FAFSA.



**STUDENT LOANS CAN BE AN AFFORDABLE OPTION – LET’S EXPLAIN HOW...**

Let’s say you borrow the maximum subsidized loan amount all four years, you would borrow a total of \$19,000 as follows:

<b>Freshman</b>	<b>\$3,500</b>
<b>Sophomore</b>	<b>4,500</b>
<b>Junior</b>	<b>5,500</b>
<b>Senior</b>	<b>5,500</b>
<b>TOTAL</b>	<b>\$19,000</b>

Assuming repayment at 6% over 10 years, your monthly payment would be approximately \$200 per month.

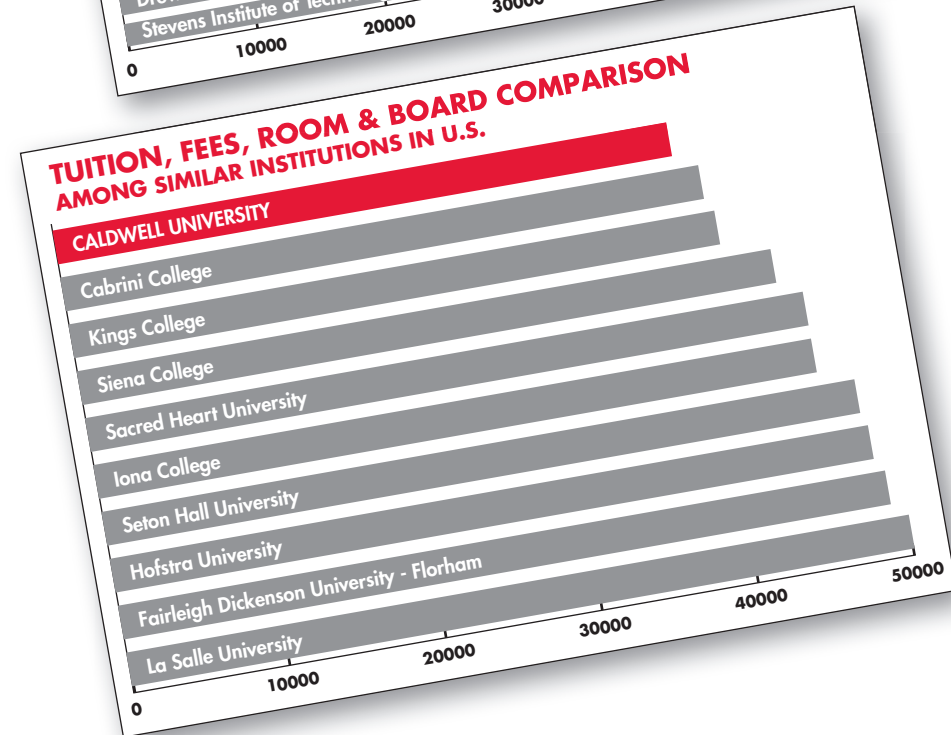
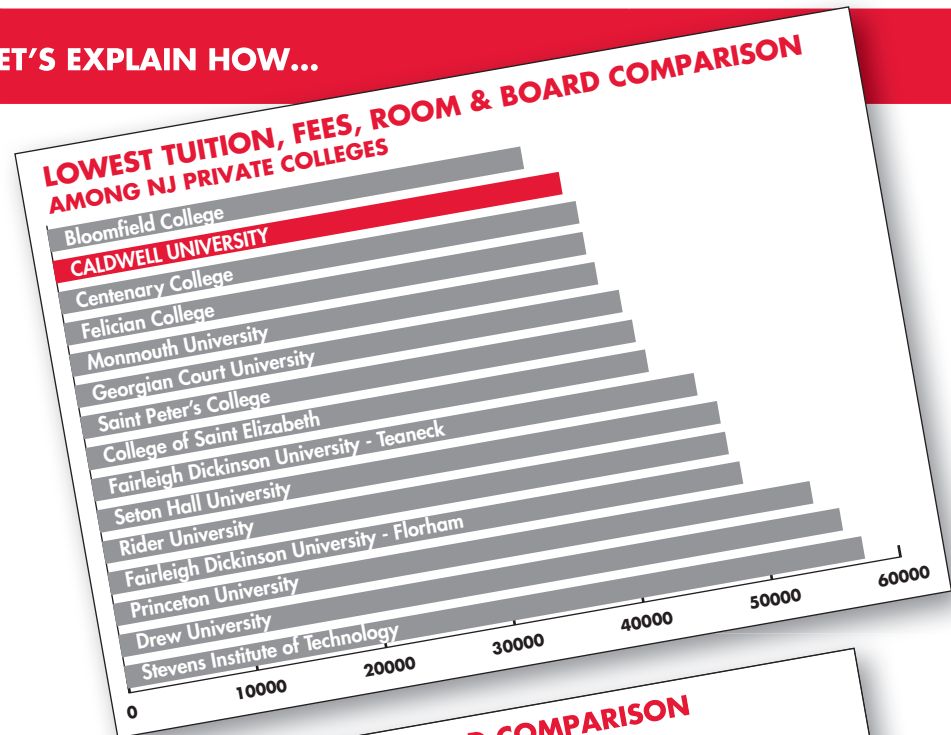
If you selected a 20-year repayment, you would pay approximately \$136 per month and if you selected a 25-year repayment, you would pay approximately \$122 per month.

Considering that as you begin your employment after graduation you could be earning monthly net income after taxes between \$2,000 and \$2,700 per month, borrowing could be an affordable option for you.

Also consider controlling costs in addition to seeking financial aid. Give careful consideration to items such as housing costs when making your decision. Consider payment plans that allow you to spread your cost over a 10-month period of time.
