Summative scores in the 2020-2021 school year were not based on student growth due to the circumstances related to the COVID-19 public health emergency. Therefore this data is not being included in this report.

Observers for all completers consist of Cooperating Teachers and University Clinical Supervisors.

When observing completers' performance in the field, observers look for application of educational strategies, content knowledge, and skills. What follows are the results of Observers evaluation data analysis:

70% of completers scored on the A level. 26% of completers scored on the B level. 4% of completers scored on the C level.

The dispositions of the Clinical Interns are rated by their assigned University Supervisors during their semester of Student Teaching. The student dispositions were compared to the NJ Professional Standards For Teachers. Overall, the clinical interns for the 2022- 2023 school year had a mean score of meeting the standards at the Proficient and Exemplary levels. The fall semester had an overall mean of 90% and the spring 97% for a total mean of 94%. In the fall, Learner Development and Assessment had the lowest performance at 67%, and in the Spring, Application of Content Knowledge was 67%. All other standards for each semester ranged from 89% to 100%.

Completer: A candidate who successfully satisfied all program requirements of a preparation program at least six months previously and who is employed in a position for which they were prepared for state licensure.
